The students are the most important stakeholders of Higher Education system. To understand the requirements of the students and to provide a well-designed systematic academic knowledge, focusing higher education and corporate requirements. The institution has collected feedback from students. A special five-point rating scale was adopted to get the opinion of the students on curriculum. The maximum score is 5 indicates-Excellent, 4 indicates-Very Good, 3 indicates-Good, 2 indicates-Average and 1 indicates -Poor. The college has received total of 433(527) student's feedback on the curriculum prescribed by the university and feedback on the value-added courses. The questionnaire is stated below as parameters and symbols are assigned to each questions and data collected is presented in tabular and graphical forms depicting the relevant question



From the above Table and Graph enclosed, it is evident, that the students have given more than 83% of their response positively, i.e., majority of the students' responses are between excellent, very Good and Good for the questions asked for finding out their views on the curriculum adopted by the institution, prescribed by the university. Some of the important highlights of the response of the students is regarding

90% of the students have given positive feedback for expected outcome of the course, value added programmes, analytical development of the course.

79 and 80 % of them have given teaching methods followed by the teachers and assessment and evaluation.99 % of the students have given excellent feedback for analytical development.

In the current academic year, students have increased the positivity towards most of the parameters, but not happy for Value Added Programs and Course activities are relevant to career development, curriculum encourages self-learning, assessment and evaluation which is responded comparatively low by 4%. Strategies need to be taken for further improvement.

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
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FACULTY FEEDBACK REPORT ON CURRICULUM- 2016-17

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
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ALUMNI FEEDBACK ON CURRICULUM- 2016-17

From the table and graph, it can be analysed that 87.6 % of the respondents, felt that the course is appropriate and value-added course provided the necessary practical orientation required to bridge the skill gap between academia and industry.

100 % of the alumni felt that the teachers have adequate knowledge in the subjects taught.

88.4% of the alumni felt that the college has systematic method of planning in teaching learning evaluation

81.4% of the respondents felt that the evaluation and assessment mechanism in the college is transparent.

87.5% of the respondents felt that library learning resources of the college is extremely good

81.3% of the alumni felt that the college has adequate sports facility, provides necessary encouragement for extension and extra-curricular facility

91.2% of the alumni feel that the college contributes positively for their holistic development.
